Kunzru (*Transmission*, 2004, etc.) recreates the passionate energies of the '70s quite convincingly, channeling the history of a British radical group called Angry Brigade and dramatizing the fluctuations of Chris' s unrealized hopes in blistering conversational exchanges (including a particularly memorable one during an explosive " Criticism-Self-Criticism " session among self-proclaimed revolutionaries).

Having briefly worked as a terrorist to protest the Vietnam War, Chris Carver hides his past from his suburban family and friends before a ghost from his past forces him to flee, a circumstance during which
